The Club is also very fortunate to have **Bill Berry**

The membership generally judges the health of the Club by its membership status, its fiscal and physical condition, and the activities of its members. Congratulations to all!

One of the privileges of the Commodore is to select the recipients of our two annual awards, and I was particularly pleased to be able to award the Distinguished Service



Award to **Jim Sisson** for his several years of dedication to overseeing the finances of the Club and maintaining the Club's data base, tasks which require weekly, if not daily attention. For the first time, the Tom Reich Sportsmanship award was given to not one, but two members, **Carol and Mike Gordon**, who exhibited those traits of sportsmanship, both individually and as a couple for which the award had been established. Additionally, Vice Commodore Neilson nominated **David Torbert** as our Club's candidate for U S Sailing's National Sportsmanship Award.

It has indeed been an honor and a pleasure to have served as you Commodore, and I look forward to this upcoming year under the leadership of Commodore **Pauline Neilson**. Her programs for 2004, with an emphasis on education, as voiced in her acceptance speech at the Christmas party, should move the membership to a new level of enjoyment of the sport of sailing.

Subject: Condensed Internal Audit Report

During 2003, I made a comprehensive internal audit of the Club's financial transactions and systems for the years 2002 and 2001, and member accounts at 3/31/03. I also assessed the accounting and administrative controls in use and audited cash balances and tax reporting.

Audit Conclusions:

I found NO evidence of fraud and NO significant accounting errors. I found that income and expenses were properly accounted for in accordance with policies in use, that liquid assets and long-term liabilities were properly accounted for and under the Treasurer's accounting control, and that tax reporting was in accordance with legal requirements.

Recommendations:

My primary recommendation is that Accounting Policies and Procedures be adopted to assist future Treasurers and Boards in meeting their accounting and financial oversight responsibilities. I have provided a document outlining the policies and procedures that I recommend.

I also recommend that improvements be made in our procedures for documenting major purchases and construction contract expenditures.

Other recommendations are contained in the Executive Summary dated October 18, 2003.

Audit Reporting:

Detailed findings were reviewed with Treasurer Jim Sisson. An Executive Summary of my findings, conclusions, and recommendations was presented to the Board both orally and in writing on October 20, 2003. The Board voted to accept and endorse my report. At your request, copies of that approved report, along with documents outlining the Accounting Policies and Procedures referred to above will be available for inspection by voting members at the Annual Meeting on November 15, 2003.

2003 B S C POWER BOATS REPORT

Well sailors, we have had a good year with the BSC power boats overall. No major problems in 2003 and our race committees and PRO's have done a good job. I think the power boats are sound mechanically, but I want to do a lot of cosmetic work this coming year. Most of this will not be costly but will require time. I am going to rip up and pitch the carpet on the larger Com. boat and apply a few coats of oil base stain on the deck. **Nelson Sharp** has donated the stain and we will do this sometime this winter. Thanks Nelson.....and we missed you at the wonderful BSC Christmas party. **SANTA** was looking for your daughter, **Madison** !!

The pontoon boats will be hauled, pressure washed and drained for a few days. The older pontoon boat outboard motor has been drained of all fuel in the carb., so do not try to start it. If it has to be put in service, starting fluid would probably have to be used as well as priming the fuel line. Remember mates.... the two stroke outboards are oil injected: we DO NOT add oil to the tank. The two stroke oil is added to the dedicated reservoirs. Call me if you have any questions on our power boats. Extra oil and charged 12 volt batteries are in the locked storage metal building (which is currently organized and neat.....hint.....please keep it that way mates.)

I want to establish weekly communication (when there are Sunday races or regattas) between myself and the PRO's.....now this means: if you do not call me I will be calling you. I take calls 8 AM - 10 PM any day. 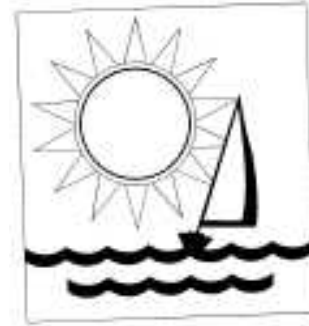
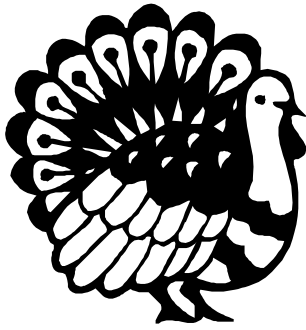
