

One-Day Regattas

This policy concerning One-Day regattas is to promote competitive sailing, be convenient, meet as many needs of the membership and encourage participation. Its aim is to (a) provide sufficient time for racing (i.e., both in number of races and in length of races); (b) reflect the Club's commitments towards the continued growth and enhancement of the Junior Sailing Program; (c) consider seasonal factors, such as available day light and temperatures; and (d) consider the needs of the membership to encourage participation.

- A. One-Day Regattas, unless otherwise posted in the *Hornblower*, will be held on Saturdays.
- B. Racing will begin at 12:30 (i.e., first flag). Race Committee shall be ready to leave the dock at 11:45.
- C. Three races will be scheduled. (more maybe sailed by mutual agreement)
- D. There will be a registration sheet at the Club house until the end of the skippers meeting. Additional registration will be accepted on the water. It is the responsibility of the skipper who wishes to register on the water to hail the Race Committee with his/her name, sail number and class and receive acknowledgment from the Race Committee.
- E. Unless otherwise posted in the *Hornblower*, there will be a skippers meeting at 11:30. Races will be conducted in accordance with the Club's standard sailing instructions.
- F. For race management and scoring purposes, the number of fleets will be based on those boats registered 15 minutes before the scheduled start of the first race of the regatta.
- G. Normally, there will be one start for all yachts. Any changes regarding starts will be posted as provided for in the section "Notices to Competitors."
- H. Any fleet with five or more registrants 15 minutes prior to the first race of the day will be scored as a fleet. The open or handicap fleet may consist of as few as three boats.
